13		The S	tate Board of Education shall adopt rules governing interscholastic		
14		athleti	c activities conducted by local boards of education, including		
15		eligibi	lity for student participation. Students attending home schools shall be		
16		permi	tted to participate in interscholastic athletic activities in accordance		
17		with t	he requirements of G.S. 115C-565.1. With regard to middle schools		
18		and hi	gh schools, the rules shall provide for the following:		
19		a.	All coaches, school nurses, athletic directors, first responders,		
20			volunteers, students who participate in interscholastic athletic		
21			activities, and the parents of those students shall receive, on an		
22			annual basis, a concussion and head injury information sheet. School		
23			employees, first responders, volunteers, and students must sign the		
24			sheet and return it to the coach before they can participate in		
25			interscholastic athletic activities, including tryouts, practices, or		
26			competition. Parents must sign the sheet and return it to the coach		
27			before their children can participate in any such interscholastic		
28			athletic activities. The signed sheets shall be maintained in		
29			accordance with sub-subdivision d. of this subdivision.		
30			For the purpose of this subdivision, a concussion is a traumatic		
31			brain injury caused by a direct or indirect impact to the head that		
32			results in disruption of normal brain function, which may or may not		
33			result in loss of consciousness.		
34		b.	If a student participating in an interscholastic athletic activity		
35			exhibits signs or symptoms consistent with concussion, the student		
36			shall be removed from the activity at that time and shall not be		



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1 2		allowed to return to play or practice that day. The student shall not return to play or practice on a subsequent day until the student is			
3		evaluated by and receives written clearance for such participation			
4		from (i) a physician licensed under Article 1 of Chapter 90 of the			
5 6		General Statutes with training in concussion management, (ii) a			
6 7		neuropsychologist licensed under Article 18A of Chapter 90 of the General Statutes with training in concussion management and			
8		working in consultation with a physician licensed under Article 1 of			
9		Chapter 90 of the General Statutes, (iii) an athletic trainer licensed			
10		under Article 34 of Chapter 90 of the General Statutes, (iv) a			
11		physician assistant, consistent with the limitations of G.S. 90-18.1, or			
12		(v) a nurse practitioner, consistent with the limitations of			
13		G.S. 90-18.2.

15		deal with serious injuries and acute medical conditions in which the			
16		condition of the patient may deteriorate rapidly. The plan shall

19		transport. This plan must be (i) in writing, (ii) reviewed by an athletic			
20		trainer licensed in North Carolina, (iii) approved by the principal of
