<u>(1)</u>	Coordinate statewide efforts for the study of the incidence of rare disease
	within the State and the status of the rare disease community.
<u>(2)</u>	Act as the advisory body on rare diseases to the Secretary on research,
	diagnosis, treatment, and education relating to rare diseases.
<u>(3)</u>	Coordinate the performance of the advisory council's duties with other rare
	disease advisory bodies, community-based organizations, and other public
	and private organizations within the State for the purpose of ensuring greater
	cooperation regarding the research, diagnosis, and treatment of rare diseases
	between the State and federal agencies, including but not exclusive to, the
	United States National Institutes of Health (NIH) and the United States Food
	and Drug Administration (FDA). Such coordination shall require, when
	appropriate, the following:
	<u>a.</u> <u>Disseminating the advisory council's research, identified best</u> practices, and policy recommendations.
