BILL SUMMARY:

Amends several provisions of elections law to restore partisan judicial elections for Justices of the Supreme Court and Judges of the Court of Appeals.

ASSUMPTIONS AND METHODOLOGY:

The county boards of elections are responsible for the operations and funding of elections; those responsibilities include producing ballots, operating elections, registering voters, purchasing and maintaining voting equipment, and paying for all aspects of running elections.

House Bill 8

There are no additional costs to the State Board of Elections or the local boards of elections for this change. The county boards of elections already include these particular judge candidates on the primary ballot for the purpose of reducing the number of candidates to two candidates and then again general election ballot for final election.
