Legislative Retirement Note

BILL NUMBER: Senate Bill 2 (Second Edition)

SHORT TITLE: Magistrates Recusal for Civil Ceremonies.

SPONSOR(S):

FUNDS AFFECTED: State General Fund, State Highway Fund, other State employer receipts

SYSTEM OR PROGRAM AFFECTED: Teachers' and State Employees' Retirement

System (TSERS)

BILL SUMMARY:

Section 5 of the bill grants membership service in TSERS to any magistrate who resigned, or was terminated from, his or her office between October 6, 2014 and the effective date of the bill who is subsequently reappointed within 90 days after the effective date of the bill. The service will be granted for the full period of the break in service at the rate of compensation that would have applied had there been no break. The Judicial Department is required to pay both the employee and employer contributions related to this service to TSERS.

No other sections of the bill affect State retirement systems.

EFFECTIVE DATE: The bill is effective when it becomes law.

ESTIMATED IMPACT ON STATE:

Buck Consultants, the actuary for the System, estimates that this bill will result in a change in the annual required contribution for TSERS of less than 0.01% of payroll. The bill will result in a small increase in contributions made by the Judicial Department.

Hartman and Associates, the actuary for the General Assembly, estimates that the bill will not have a material impact on TSERS due to the small number of members impacted and the submission of all contributions related to the service.

ASSUMPTIONS AND METHODOLOGY:

A list of eight magistrates who have resigned their posts was provided.

The cost estimates of the System's Actuary are based on the employee data, actuarial assumptions and actuarial methods used to prepare the December 31, 2013 actuarial valuations. Significant membership and financial statistics, assumptions, and methods are shown in the following tables:
