2 AN ACT TO DEVELOP A PILOT PROGRAM IN CUMBERLAND COUNTY TO PROVIDE 3 HEALTH CARE SERVICES TO VETERANS. 4 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts: 5 SECTION 1.(a) Pilot Program. – The Department of Health and Human Services and the Department of Military and Veterans Affairs, in coordination with Community Care of 6 North Carolina and Maxim Healthcare Services, shall develop and implement a two-year pilot 7 program in Cumberland County to provide health care services to veterans. The pilot program 8 9 shall consist of the following initiatives: A health care initiative to provide to veterans increased access to health care 10 (1)resources through the care coordination efforts of community health workers. 11 A workforce initiative to recruit and train unemployed and underemployed 12 (2)13 veterans as community health workers for the health care initiative described in subdivision (1) of this subsection. 14 **SECTION 1.(b)** Termination. – The pilot program authorized by this section shall 15 terminate on June 30, 2020. 16 SECTION 1.(c) Evaluation. – By February 1, 2021, the Department of Health and 17 Human Services shall conduct and submit to the Joint Legislative Oversight Committee on 18 Health and Human Services a comprehensive evaluation of the pilot program authorized by this 19 20 section. The comprehensive evaluation shall include at least all of the following: 21 The specific ways in which the pilot program's health care initiative provided (1)to veterans increased access to health care resources. 22 23

- (2) The total number of unemployed and underemployed veterans who were recruited and trained as community health workers under the pilot program's workforce initiative.
 - (3) The specific ways in which the Department of Health and Human Services spent the funds appropriated under Section 2 of this act.

SECTION 2. There is appropriated from the General Fund to the Department of Health and Human Services the sum of four hundred thousand dollars (\$400,000) in nonrecurring funds for the 2018-2019 fiscal year to support the development and implementation of the pilot program authorized by Section 1 of this act.

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SECTION 3. This act becomes effective July 1, 2018.



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
