12		ental Health Workers' Bill of Rights.
13	It is the policy of this State that the core elements of the Mental Health Workers' Bill of Rights	
14	for workers emp	loyed to carry out the provisions of this Chapter shall include all of the following:
15	<u>(1)</u>	The right to a safe workplace, including protecting oneself from harm with
16		consideration for the safety of the patients, and the right to refuse work that
17		poses a danger to one's health and safety.
18	<u>(2)</u>	The right to adequate staffing levels.
19	<u>(3)</u>	The right to adequate and updated equipment and techniques to insure safer
20		working conditions and quality care for the patients.
21	<u>(4)</u>	The right to family-supporting wages so that mental health care workers can
22		devote their time to the care of their patients and not have to take on second
23		<u>jobs.</u>
24	<u>(5)</u>	The right to refuse excessive overtime.
25	<u>(6)</u>	The right to a timely briefing about the behaviors of patients that workers are
26		assigned to care for.
27	<u>(7)</u>	The right to be treated with respect and dignity regardless of job classification.
28	<u>(8)</u>	The right to fair and equal treatment and opportunities regardless of race,
29		gender, age, national origin, immigration, sexual orientation, disabilities,
30		physical abilities, or religion."
31	SEC'	TION 2. This act is effective when it becomes law.
