Short Title: Raise Minimum Age to Access Tobacco Products. (Public)

Sponsors: Representatives Murphy, Bert Jones, Lambeth, and Grange (Primary Sponsors).

1 A BILL TO BE ENTITLED
2 AN ACT GRADUALLY RAISING THE MINIMUM AGE FOR PERSONS NOT SERVING
3 ON ACTIVE DUTY IN THE UNITED STATES ARMED FORCES FROM EIGHTEEN
4 TO TWENTY-ONE FOR THE PURCHASE OR RECEIPT OF TOBACCO PRODUCTS,
5 TOBACCO-DERIVED PRODUCTS, VAPOR PRODUCTS, AND CIGARETTE
6 WRAPPING PAPERS.

7 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

8 SECTION 1.(a) G.S. 14-313 reads as rewritten:

9 "§ 14-313. Youth access to tobacco products, tobacco-derived products, vapor products,
10 and cigarette wrapping papers.

11 (a) Definitions. – The following definitions apply in this section:

12 (1) Active duty. – Full-time duty in the active military service of the United
13 States, including service by members of the reserve component (National
14 Guard and Reserve) while serving under published orders for active duty or
15 full-time training. The term does not include service by members of the
16 reserve component (National Guard and Reserve) who are performing active
17 duty or active duty for training under military calls or orders specifying
18 periods of less than 31 calendar days.

19 (1a) Armed Forces. – Includes all components of the United States Army, Navy,
20 Air Force, Marine Corps, and Coast Guard.

21 (1b) Distribute. – To sell, furnish, give, or provide tobacco products, including
22 tobacco product samples or cigarette wrapping papers, to the ultimate
23 consumer.

24 (2) Proof of age. – A drivers license or other photographic identification that
25 includes the bearer's date of birth that purports to establish that the person is
26 18 years of age or older.

27 ...

28 (b) Sale or distribution to persons under the age of 18 years. – If any person shall
29 distribute, or aid, assist, or abet any other person in distributing tobacco products or cigarette
30 wrapping papers to any person ~~under the age of 18 years, born on or after January 1, 2000,~~ or if
31 any person shall purchase tobacco products or cigarette wrapping papers on behalf of a person
32 ~~under the age of 18 years, born on or after January 1, 2000,~~ the person shall be guilty of a Class
33 2 misdemeanor; provided, however, that it shall not be unlawful to (i) distribute tobacco
34 products or cigarette wrapping papers to an employee when required in the performance of the
35 employee's ~~duties.~~duties or (ii) sell or distribute tobacco products or cigarette wrapping papers
36 to a person born on or after January 1, 2000, who is serving on active duty in the Armed



1 Forces. Retail distributors of tobacco products shall prominently display near the point of sale a
2 sign in letters at least five-eighths of an inch high which states the following:

3 FOR THE PERIOD BEGINNING JANUARY 1, 2018,

4 AND ENDING DECEMBER 31, 2020,

5 N.C. LAW STRICTLY PROHIBITS

6 THE PURCHASE OF TOBACCO PRODUCTS, TOBACCO-DERIVED PRODUCTS,

7 VAPOR PRODUCTS, AND CIGARETTE WRAPPING PAPERS

8 BY PERSONS UNDER THE AGE OF 18. BORN ON OR AFTER JANUARY 1, 2000.

9 PROOF OF AGE REQUIRED.

10 Failure to post the required sign shall be an infraction punishable by a fine of twenty-five
11 dollars (\$25.00) for the first offense and seventy-five dollars (\$75.00) for each succeeding
12 offense.

13 A person engaged in the sale of tobacco products or cigarette wrapping papers shall demand
14 proof of age or proof of active duty in the Armed Forces from a prospective purchaser if the
15 person has reasonable grounds to believe that the prospective purchaser ~~is under 18 years of~~
16 ~~age was born on or after January 1, 2000.~~ Failure to demand proof of age or proof of active
17 duty in the Armed Forces as required by this subsection is a Class 2 misdemeanor if in fact the
18 prospective purchaser ~~is under 18 years of age was born on or after January 1, 2000, and is not~~
19 ~~servng on active duty in the Armed Forces.~~ Retail distributors of tobacco products or cigarette
20 wrapping papers shall train their sales employees in the requirements of this law. Proof of any
21 of the following shall be a defense to any action brought under this subsection:

- 22 (1) The defendant demanded, was shown, and reasonably relied upon proof of
23 age or proof of active duty in the Armed Forces in the case of a retailer, or
24 any other documentary or written evidence of age or active duty in the
25 Armed Forces in the case of a nonretailer.
- 26 (2) The defendant relied on the electronic system established and operated by
27 the Division of Motor Vehicles pursuant to G.S. 20-37.02.
- 28 (3) The defendant relied on a biometric identification system that demonstrated
29 (i) the purchaser's age to be at least the required age for the purchase and (ii)
30 the purchaser had previously registered with the seller or seller's agent a
31 drivers license, a special identification card issued under G.S. 20-37.7, a
32 military identification card, or a passport showing the purchaser's date of
33 birth and bearing a physical description of the person named on the card.

34 (b1) Distribution of tobacco products. – Tobacco products shall not be distributed in
35 vending machines; provided, however, vending machines distributing tobacco products are
36 permitted (i) in any establishment which is open only to persons 18 years of age and older; (ii)
37 in any establishment which is open only to persons serving on active duty in the Armed Forces;
38 ~~or (ii)(iii)~~ in any establishment if the vending machine is under the continuous control of the
39 owner or licensee of the premises or an employee thereof and can be operated only upon
40 activation by the owner, licensee, or employee prior to each purchase and the vending machine
41 is not accessible to the public when the establishment is closed. The owner, licensee, or
42 employee shall demand proof of age or proof of active duty in the Armed Forces from a
43 prospective purchaser if the person has reasonable grounds to believe that the prospective
44 purchaser ~~is under 18 years of age was born on or after January 1, 2000.~~ Failure to demand
45 proof of age or proof of active duty in the Armed Forces as required by this subsection is a
46 Class 2 misdemeanor if in fact the prospective purchaser ~~is under 18 years of age was born on~~
47 ~~or after January 1, 2000, and is not serving on active duty in the Armed Forces.~~ Proof that the
48 defendant demanded, was shown, and reasonably relied upon proof of age or proof of active
49 duty in the Armed Forces shall be a defense to any action brought under this subsection.
50 Vending machines distributing tobacco products in establishments not meeting the above
51 conditions shall be removed prior to December 1, 1997. Vending machines distributing

1 tobacco-derived products, vapor products, or components of vapor products in establishments
2 not meeting the above conditions shall be removed prior to August 1, 2013. Any person
3 distributing tobacco products through vending machines in violation of this subsection shall be
4 guilty of a Class 2 misdemeanor.

5 (b2) Internet distribution of tobacco products. – A person engaged in the distribution of
6 tobacco products through the Internet or other remote sales methods shall perform an age or
7 active duty verification through an independent, third-party ~~age~~-verification service that
8 compares information available from public records to the personal information entered by the
9 individual during the ordering process to establish that the individual ordering the tobacco
10 products is 18 years of age or ~~older~~, or is serving on active duty in the Armed Forces.

11 (c) Purchase by persons ~~under the age of 18 years~~, born on or after January 1, 2000. – If
12 any person ~~under the age of 18 years~~, born on or after January 1, 2000, purchases or accepts
13 receipt, or attempts to purchase or accept receipt, of tobacco products or cigarette wrapping
14 papers, or presents or offers to any person any purported proof of age which is false, fraudulent,
15 or not actually his or her own, for the purpose of purchasing or receiving any tobacco product
16 or cigarette wrapping papers, the person shall be guilty of a Class 2 misdemeanor; provided,
17 however, that it shall not be unlawful for (i) an employee to purchase or accept receipt of
18 tobacco products or cigarette wrapping papers when required in the performance of the
19 employee's ~~duties~~, duties or (ii) a person serving on active duty in the Armed Forces to purchase
20 or accept receipt of tobacco products or cigarette wrapping papers.

21 (d) Sending or assisting a person ~~[less than] 18 years~~, born on or after January 1, 2000, to
22 purchase or receive tobacco products or cigarette wrapping papers. – If any person shall send a
23 person ~~less than 18 years of age~~, born on or after January 1, 2000, to purchase, acquire, receive,
24 or attempt to purchase, acquire, or receive tobacco products or cigarette wrapping papers, or if
25 any person shall aid or abet a person who is ~~less than 18 years of age~~ was born on or after
26 January 1, 2000, in purchasing, acquiring, or receiving or attempting to purchase, acquire, or
27 receive tobacco products or cigarette wrapping papers, the person shall be guilty of a Class 2
28 misdemeanor; provided, however, persons ~~under the age of 18~~ born on or after January 1, 2000,
29 may be enlisted by police or local sheriffs' departments to test compliance if the testing is under
30 the direct supervision of that law enforcement department and written parental consent is
31 provided; provided further, that the Department of Health and Human Services shall have the
32 authority, pursuant to a written plan prepared by the Secretary of Health and Human Services,
33 to use persons ~~under 18 years of age~~ born on or after January 1, 2000, in annual, random,
34 unannounced inspections, provided that prior written parental consent is given for the
35 involvement of these persons and that the inspections are conducted for the sole purpose of
36 preparing a scientifically and methodologically valid statistical study of the extent of success
37 the State has achieved in reducing the availability of tobacco products to persons ~~under the age~~
38 ~~of 18~~, born on or after January 1, 2000, and preparing any report to the extent required by
39 section 1926 of the federal Public Health Service Act (42 USC § 300x-26).

41 **SECTION 1.(b)** Subsection (a) of this section becomes effective January 1, 2018,
42 and expires on December 31, 2020.

43 **SECTION 2.(a)** G.S. 14-313, as amended by subsection (a) of Section 1 of this act,
44 reads as rewritten:

45 "**§ 14-313. Youth access to tobacco products, tobacco-derived products, vapor products,**
46 **and cigarette wrapping papers.**

47 (a) Definitions. – The following definitions apply in this section:

 16 person shall purchase tobacco products or cigarette wrapping papers on behalf of a person ~~born~~
 17 ~~on or after January 1, 2000,~~under the age of 21, the person shall be guilty of a Class 2
 18 misdemeanor; provided, however, that it shall not be unlawful to (i) distribute tobacco products
 19 or cigarette wrapping papers to an employee when required in the performance of the
 20 employee's duties or (ii) sell or distribute tobacco products or cigarette wrapping papers to a
 21 person ~~born on or after January 1, 2000,~~under the age of 21 who is serving on active duty in the

32 PROOF OF AGE REQUIRED.

33 Failure to post the required sign shall be an infraction punishable by a fine of twenty-five
 34 dollars (\$25.00) for the first offense and seventy-five dollars (\$75.00) for each succeeding

36 A person engaged in the sale of tobacco products or cigarette wrapping papers shall demand

27 distributing tobacco products through vending machines in violation of this subsection shall be
28 guilty of a Class 2 misdemeanor.

29 (b2) Internet distribution of tobacco products. – A person engaged in the distribution of
30 tobacco products through the Internet or other remote sales methods shall perform an age or
31 active duty verification through an independent, third-party verification service that compares
32 information available from public records to the personal information entered by the individual
33 during the ordering process to establish that the individual ordering the tobacco products is ~~18~~
34 21 years of age or older, or is serving on active duty in the Armed Forces.

35 (c) Purchase by persons ~~born on or after January 1, 2000~~ under 21 years of age. – If any
36 person ~~born on or after January 1, 2000~~ under 21 years of age purchases or accepts receipt, or
37 attempts to purchase or accept receipt, of tobacco products or cigarette wrapping papers, or
38 presents or offers to any person any purported proof of age which is false, fraudulent, or not
39 actually his or her own, for the purpose of purchasing or receiving any tobacco product or
40 cigarette wrapping papers, the person shall be guilty of a Class 2 misdemeanor; provided,
41 however, that it shall not be unlawful for (i) an employee to purchase or accept receipt of
42 tobacco products or cigarette wrapping papers when required in the performance of the
43 employee's duties or (ii) a person serving on active duty in the Armed Forces to purchase or
44 accept receipt of tobacco products or cigarette wrapping papers.

45 (d) Sending or assisting a person ~~born on or after January 1, 2000~~ under 21 years of age
46 to purchase or receive tobacco products or cigarette wrapping papers. – If any person shall send
47 a person ~~born on or after January 1, 2000~~ under 21 years of age to purchase, acquire, receive, or
48 attempt to purchase, acquire, or receive tobacco products or cigarette wrapping papers, or if any
49 person shall aid or abet a person ~~who was born on or after January 1, 2000~~ under 21 years of
50 age in purchasing, acquiring, or receiving or attempting to purchase, acquire, or receive tobacco
51 products or cigarette wrapping papers, the person shall be guilty of a Class 2 misdemeanor;

1 provided, however, persons ~~born on or after January 1, 2000,~~under 21 years of age may be
2 enlisted by police or local sheriffs' departments to test compliance if the testing is under the
3 direct supervision of that law enforcement department and written parental consent is provided;
4 provided further, that the Department of Health and Human Services shall have the authority,
5 pursuant to a written plan prepared by the Secretary of Health and Human Services, to use
6 persons ~~born on or after January 1, 2000,~~under 21 years of age in annual, random, unannounced
7 inspections, provided that prior written parental consent is given for the involvement of these
8 persons and that the inspections are conducted for the sole purpose of preparing a scientifically
9 and methodologically valid statistical study of the extent of success the State has achieved in
10 reducing the availability of tobacco products to persons ~~born on or after January 1, 2000,~~under
11 21 years of age and preparing any report to the extent required by section 1926 of the federal
12 Public Health Service Act (42 USC § 300x-26).

14 **SECTION 2.(b)** Subsection (a) of this section becomes effective January 1, 2021.

15 **SECTION 3.** Except as otherwise provided, this act is effective when it becomes
16 law.
