1	A BILL TO BE ENTITLED
2	AN ACT TO PROVIDE ADDITIONAL FLEXIBILITY FOR CERTAIN REGIONAL
3	WATER AND SEWER INFRASTRUCTURE FUNDING.
4	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:
5	SECTION 1. Section 14.20A of S.L. 2016-94 reads as rewritten:
6	"REGIONAL WATER AND SEWER <del>AUTHORITY</del> FUNDING
7	"SECTION 14.20A.(a) Of the funds appropriated to the Department of Environmental
8	Quality, Division of Water Infrastructure, by this act, the sum of fourteen million five hundred
9	forty-eight thousand nine hundred eighty-one dollars (\$14,548,981) shall be used by the
10	Division to fund interconnection and interconnection, extension of water lines to participating
11	counties and municipalities undertaken by a Regional Water and Sewer Authority established
12	pursuant to Article 1 of Chapter 162A of the General Statutes, provided that the Authority
13	includes lines, and related water system modification and expansion involving the Counties of
14	Rockingham and Guilford and one or more municipalities within those counties. The funds
15	allocated by this section may also be used for one or more regional interconnections with
16	municipalities in Rockingham or Guilford Counties that do not join the Authority described by
17	this subsection if the interconnections are necessary to provide sufficient water resources to
18	support the water system expansion needed to meet current and planned future needs of the
19	Authority.the municipalities of Oak Ridge, Stokesdale, Summerfield, Reidsville, Madison, and
20	Mayodan. Of the funds allocated by this section, no more than twenty-five percent (25%) of the
21	funds shall be used for Guilford County and may include one or more of the municipalities
22	listed in this section located in Guilford County, and no more than seventy-five percent (75%)
23	shall be used for Rockingham County and may include one or more of the municipalities listed
24	in this section located in Rockingham County. The funds allocated by this section may be spent
25	for planning, design, survey, real property acquisition, construction, repair, and any other
26	activities necessary to improve the performance and reliability and expand the capacity and
27	service footprint of participating water systems in Rockingham and Guilford Counties. The
28	Counties of Rockingham and Guilford and the municipalities participating in the
29	interconnection and extension of water lines within each county funded by this section shall
30	agree on the use of the funds allocated by this section through any combination of (i) interlocal
31	agreements under Article 20 of Chapter 160A of the General Statutes that specify, at a
32	minimum, the ownership of the water lines and infrastructure funded by this section and
33	long-term maintenance, repair, and replacement responsibility or (ii) one or more regional
34	water and sewer authorities under Article 1 of Chapter 162A of the General Statutes.



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1	"SECTION 14.20A.(b) If the Regional Water Authority described by this section is
2	formed prior to June 30, 2017, the Division of Water Infrastructure shall transfer the funds
3	allocated by this section to the Authority for the purposes described in subsection (a) of this
4	section. Otherwise, the funds allocated by this section shall revert to the General Fund.
5	Notwithstanding G.S. 143C-6-23(f1)(1), G.S. 143C-6-23(f1)(1) and G.S. 143C-1-2, funds
6	allocated to the Authority but not used by this section shall be held in reserve by the Office of
7	State Budget and Management and the allocations to each County shall be released when the
8	County and one or more of the municipalities specified in subsection (a) of this section reach
9	agreement on the funds allocated to that County by this section through interlocal agreements
10	or the formation of regional water and sewer authorities or a combination of interlocal
11	agreements and regional water and sewer authorities. Funds not spent or encumbered by June
12	30, 2020, shall be returned by the local governments or regional water and sewer authority to
13	the Office of State Budget and Management and revert to the General Fund."
14	<b>SECTION 2.</b> This act is effective when it becomes law.
