22	interstate registration form designed by the Federal Election Commission pursuant to section 9				
23	of the National Voter Registration Act, if the interstate form is submitted in accordance with				
24	G.S. 163-82.6.				
25	(c) Agency Application Form. <u>Application</u> . – The county board of elections where an				
26	applicant resides shall accept as application for any of the purposes set out in subsection (a) of				
27	this section a form automatic voter registration developed pursuant to G.S. 163-82.19 or				
28	G.S. 163-82.20."				
29	SECTION 2. G.S. 163-82.6 reads as rewritten:				
30	"§ 163-82.6. Acceptance of application forms.				
31	(a) How the Form May Be Submitted. – The county board of elections shall accept any				
32	form described in G.S. 163-82.3 if the applicant submits the form by mail, facsimile				
33	transmission, transmission of a scanned document, or in person, person, or by automatic voter				
34 25	registration pursuant to G.S. 163-82.19, 163-82.20, 115D-5, or 116-11. The applicant may				
35	delegate the submission of the form to another person. Any person who communicates to an				
36	applicant acceptance of that delegation shall deliver that form so that it is received by the

1 appropriate county board of elections in time to satisfy the registration deadline in subdivision 2 (1) or (2) of subsection (c) of this section for the next election. It shall be a Class 2 3 misdemeanor for any person to communicate to the applicant acceptance of that delegation and 4 then fail to make a good faith effort to deliver the form so that it is received by the county 5 board of elections in time to satisfy the registration deadline in subdivision (1) or (2) of 6 subsection (c) of this section for the next election. It shall be an affirmative defense to a charge 7 of failing to make a good faith effort to deliver a delegated form by the registration deadline 8 that the delegatee informed the applicant that the form would not likely be delivered in time for 9 the applicant to vote in the next election. It shall be a Class 2 misdemeanor for any person to 10 sell or attempt to sell a completed voter registration form or to condition its delivery upon 11 payment. 12 . . . 13 (c) Registration Deadlines for a Primary or Election. – In order to be valid for a primary 14 or election, the form: 15 (1)If submitted by mail, must be postmarked at least 25 days before the primary or election, except that any mailed application on which the postmark is 16 17 missing or unclear is validly submitted if received in the mail not later than 18 20 days before the primary or election, 19 If submitted in person, by facsimile transmission, or-by transmission of a (2)20 scanned document, or by automatic voter registration, must be received by 21 the county board of elections by a time established by that board, but no 22 earlier than 5:00 P.M., on the twenty-fifth day before the primary or election, 23 If submitted through a delegatee who violates the duty set forth in subsection (3) 24 (a) of this section, must be signed by the applicant and given to the delegatee 25 not later than 25 days before the primary or election, except as provided in 26 subsection (d) of this section." 27 28 SECTION 3. G.S. 163-82.19 reads as rewritten: 29 "§ 163-82.19. Voter Automatic voter registration at drivers license offices; coordination 30 on data interface. 31 Automatic Voter Registration at Drivers License Offices. – The Beginning July 1, (a) 32 2018, the Division of Motor Vehicles shall, pursuant to the rules adopted by in consultation 33 with the State Board of Elections, modify its forms so that-implement a method by which any 34 eligible person who applies for original issuance, renewal or correction of a drivers license, or 35 special identification card issued under G.S. 20-37.7 may, on a part of the form, complete an 36 application to register shall be automatically registered to vote, or able to update the voter's 37 registration if the voter has changed his or her address or moved from one precinct to another 38 or from one county to another. The person taking the application shall affirmatively ask if the 39 applicant is registered to vote and, if not, whether the applicant would like to register to vote. If 40 the applicant declines registration, the person taking the application shall note on the application that the applicant affirmatively declined to become registered to vote during the 41 42 transaction with the drivers license office. If the applicant wishes to register to vote, the person taking the application shall require the applicant to provide all information requested of the 43 44 applicant under G.S. 163-82.4, including declaring a preference to be affiliated with a political 45 party or a preference to be an unaffiliated voter. If an applicant who registers to vote pursuant to this section fails to declare a political party affiliation, the applicant's political affiliation 46 47 shall be designated as unaffiliated. The person taking the application shall ask if the applicant is 48 a citizen of the United States. If the applicant states that the applicant is not a citizen of the 49 United States, or declines to answer the question, the person taking the application shall inform 50 the applicant that it is a felony for a person who is not a citizen of the United States to apply to 51 register to vote. Any person who willfully and knowingly and with fraudulent intent gives false

information on the application is guilty of a Class I felony. The application shall state in clear 1 2 language the penalty for violation of this section. The necessary automatic voter registration 3 forms shall be prescribed by the State Board of Elections. The form must ask for the previous 4 voter registration address of the voter, if any. If a previous address is listed, and it is not in the 5 county of residence of the applicant, the appropriate county board of elections shall treat the 6 application as an authorization to cancel the previous registration and also process it as such 7 under the procedures of G.S. 163-82.9. If a previous address is listed and that address is in the 8 county where the voter applies to register, the application shall be processed as if it had been 9 submitted under G.S. 163-82.9. 10 The applicant shall provide an electronic signature as required under G.S. 163-82.6(b), 11 subject to the penalties for perjury, by which the applicant attests that the information provided by the applicant is true and that the applicant meets all the qualifications to become a registered 12 13 voter. 14 Registration shall become effective as provided in G.S. 163-82.7. Applications to register to 15 vote accepted at a drivers license office under this section until the deadline established in 16 G.S. 163-82.6(c)(2) shall be treated as timely made for an election, and no person who 17 completes an application at that drivers license office shall be denied the vote in that election 18 for failure to apply earlier than that deadline. 19 All applications shall be forwarded electronically transmitted by the Department of 20 Transportation to the appropriate board of elections not later than five business days after the 21 date of acceptance, according to rules which shall be promulgated by the State Board of 22 Elections. Those rules shall provide for a paperless, instant, electronic transfer of applications 23 to the appropriate board of elections. 24 Nothing in this subsection shall be construed as requiring the Department of Transportation 25 to determine eligibility for voter registration and voting. 26 (b) Coordination on Data Interface. - The Department of Transportation jointly with the 27 State Board of Elections shall develop and operate a computerized interface to match 28 information in the database of the statewide voter registration system with the drivers license 29 information in the Division of Motor Vehicles to the extent required to enable the State Board 30 of Elections and the Department of Transportation to verify the accuracy of the information 31 provided on applications for voter registration, whether the applications were received at 32 drivers license offices or elsewhere. The Department of Transportation and the State Board 33 shall implement the provisions of this subsection so as to comply with section 303 of the Help 34 America Vote Act of 2002. The Department of Transportation shall enter into an agreement 35 with the Commissioner of Social Security so as to comply with section 303 of the Help 36 America Vote Act of 2002. 37 (c) The State Board of Elections shall ensure the confidentiality of information acquired 38 pursuant to this section for purposes of automatic voter registration in accordance with 39 G.S. 163-82.4(b), including compliance with any requirements regarding a voter registering 40 pursuant to G.S. 163-82.10(d)." 1 The State Board of Elections, the Division of Adult Correction of the Department of Public 2 Safety, and the Administrative Office of the Courts shall jointly develop and implement 3 educational programs and procedures for persons to apply to register to vote at the time they are 4 restored to citizenship and all filings required have been completed under Chapter 13 of the 5 General Statutes. Those procedures shall be designed to do both of the following:

- (1) Inform the person that the restoration of rights removes the person's disqualification from voting, but that in order to vote the person must register to vote.

- Provide an opportunity to that person to register to vote.vote, including informing the person of automatic voter registration in accordance with G.S. 163-82.19, 163-82.20, 115D-5, or 116-11.

12 At a minimum, the program shall include a written notice to the person whose citizenship 13 has been restored, informing that person that the person may now register to vote, with a voter 14 registration form enclosed with the notice."

15 **SECTION 6.** The State Board of Elections shall establish and implement an 16 education and outreach campaign to inform voters of the automatic voter registration 17 procedures established pursuant to this act.

18 **SECTION 7.(a)** There is appropriated from the General Fund to the Department of 19 Transportation, Division of Motor Vehicles, the sum of one hundred eighteen thousand six 20 hundred fifty dollars (\$118,650) for the 2017-2018 fiscal year and the sum of sixteen thousand 21 six hundred sixty-four dollars (\$16,664) for the 2018-2019 fiscal year for purposes of 22 implementing the provisions of G.S. 163-82.19, as enacted by Section 3 of this act.

SECTION 7.(b) There is appropriated from the General Fund to the Department of Health and Human Services, Division of Central Management and Support, the sum of one hundred eighty-five thousand dollars (\$185,000) for the 2017-2018 fiscal year for purposes of implementing the provisions of G.S. 163-82.20, as enacted by Section 4 of this act.

SECTION 7.(c) There is appropriated from the General Fund to the Department of Health and Human Services, Division of Public Health, the sum of fifty-six thousand dollars (\$56,000) for the 2017-2018 fiscal year for purposes of implementing the provisions of G.S. 163-82.20, as enacted by Section 4 of this act.

SECTION 8. Sections 1, 2, 3 and 5 of this act become effective July 1, 2018.
Section 4 of this act becomes effective January 1, 2019. Section 7 of this act becomes effective
July 1, 2017. The remainder of this act is effective when it becomes law.
