6	opioid-related overdoses has drastically increased over the past 20 years; and

8	opioid-related over	loses is unlikely to be reduced so long as the drug continues to be made		
9	available through ill	egal distribution by drug dealers; and		
10	Whereas	, the General Assembly finds that the legal distribution of opioids should		
11	only be through a	prescription issued for a legitimate medical purpose by an individual		
12	practitioner acting in the usual course of his or her professional practice; and			
13	Whereas, it is the intent of the General Assembly to strengthen the laws to act as a			
14	greater deterrent to persons who want to illegally distribute opioids and further exacerbate the

22	epidemic are devastating families and communities across North Carolina. The General			
23	Assembly finds that the opioid crisis is overwhelming medical providers engaged in the lawful			
24	distribution of controlled substances and is straining prevention and treatment efforts. Therefore,			
25	the General Assembly enacts this law to encourage effective intervention by the criminal justice			
26	system to hold illegal drug dealers accountable for criminal conduct that results in death.
