1 A HOUSE RESOLUTION TO CREATE A NORTH CAROLINA HOUSE OF
2 REPRESENTATIVES SELECT COMMITTEE ON HOMELESSNESS.

3 Whereas, homelessness affects many citizens of this State and continues to exist
4 unabated in our communities; and

5 Whereas, homelessness affects both rural and urban populations in varying degrees;
6 and

7 Whereas, homelessness affects already vulnerable populations in this State and
8 requires State action to address a growing epidemic; and

9 Whereas, the United States Interagency Council on Homelessness (USICH) estimates
10 that 9,268 citizens of this State experience homelessness on any given day; and

11 Whereas, USICH estimates 897 family households in this State experience
12 homelessness on any given day; and

13 Whereas, USICH estimates 884 veterans in this State experience homelessness on any
14 given day; and

15 Whereas, public school data reported to the United States Department of Education
16 estimates that 26,361 public school students experienced homelessness over the course of the
17 2016-2017 school year; Now, therefore,

18 Be it resolved by the House of Representatives:

19 **SECTION 1.(a)** The House Select Committee on Homelessness (Committee) is
20 created. The purpose of the Committee is to examine homelessness and make recommendations
21 to reduce homelessness in this State. The Committee shall consist of 21 members of the House
22 of Representatives, appointed by the Speaker of the House of Representatives, who shall appoint
23 a chair from among the membership. The chair shall continue to serve until a successor is
24 appointed by the Speaker. Vacancies on the Committee shall be filled by the Speaker. The
25 Committee shall meet upon the call of the chair. The Committee may meet during the interim
26 period between sessions or recesses of the General Assembly in accordance with
27 G.S. 120-19.6(a) to study and review homelessness. A quorum of the Committee shall be a
28 majority of the Committee members. The Committee shall study:

29 (1) Different methods to address rural and urban homelessness.

30 (2) The impact of homelessness in rural and urban areas.

31 (3) Direct causes of homelessness, including unemployment, affordable housing,
32 poverty, familial disruption, substance abuse, mental health, and any other
33 issue the Committee deems appropriate.

34 (4) Any other matters the Committee deems relevant to their efforts.

35 The Committee may consult with public schools, local governments, community
36 colleges, and constituent institutions of The University of North Carolina on processes,



1 procedures, data, and current resources that have proven to be useful in determining needs in
2 each of their respective populations. The Committee may seek information from experts in the
3 fields of education, veterans affairs, mental health, crisis management, and any others deemed
4 appropriate by the chair. The Committee may study any other issue deemed relevant by the chair
5 to the charge of the Committee.

6 **SECTION 1.(b)** The Committee, while in the discharge of its official duties, may
7 exercise all powers provided for under G.S. 120-19 and Article 5A of Chapter 120 of the General
8 Statutes. The Committee may meet in the Legislative Building or the Legislative Office Building.
9 Members of the Committee shall receive subsistence and travel expenses at the rates set forth in
10 G.S. 120-3.1. The expenses of the Committee shall be paid upon the written approval of the
11 Speaker of the House of Representatives pursuant to G.S. 120-32.02(c) and G.S. 120-35 from
12 funds available to the House of Representatives for its operation.

13 **SECTION 1.(c)** The Legislative Services Commission, through the Legislative
14 Services Officer, shall assign professional staff to assist the Committee in its work. The Director
15 of Legislative Assistants of the House of Representatives shall assign clerical support to the Task
16 Force. The Committee may contract for professional, clerical, or consultant services, as provided
17 by G.S. 120-32.02.

18 **SECTION 1.(d)** The Committee shall make a preliminary report containing findings
19 and recommendations to the members of the General Assembly by May 1, 2020. The Committee
20 shall provide a final report on the results of its study, including any proposed legislation, to the
21 members of the General Assembly by December 1, 2020.

22 **SECTION 2.** This resolution is effective upon adoption.
