12			or rental of, or investment in, property, goods, or services; obtaining or	
13			providing information that will or may be used for that purpose; soliciting or	
14			encouraging a telephone subscriber's participation in any contest,	
15			sweepstakes, raffle, or lottery, whether legal or illegal; creating a lead or	
16			referral for which the solicitor will receive or hopes to receive compensation;	
17			or obtaining a charitable donation. "Telephone solicitation" also includes	
18			those transactions that are defined as "telemarketing" under the Telemarketing	
19			Sales Rule.	
20		(10)	Telephone solicitor Any individual, business establishment, business, or	
21			other legal entity doing business in this State that, directly or through	
22			salespersons or salespersons, agents, subagents, contractors, or other	
23			third-party vendors, makes or attempts to make telephone solicitations or
