Short Title: Open Amusement Parks/Arcades/Playgrounds. (Public) Sponsors: Referred to: April 18, 2019 1 A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 2 AN ACT TO AUTHORIZE AMUSEMENT PARKS, GAMING AND BUSINESS 3 ESTABLISHMENTS WITH VIDEO GAMES AND ARCADE GAMES, AND PUBLIC 4 PLAYGROUNDS TO RESUME OPERATIONS. 5 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts: 6 SECTION 1.(a) Notwithstanding Executive Order No. 141, Easing Restrictions on 7 Travel, Business Operations, and Mass Gatherings: Phase Two, issued by Governor Roy A. 8 Cooper on May 20, 2020, any establishment that is an (i) amusement park or (ii) gaming and 9 business establishment with video games and arcade games, as referenced in Section 8 of 10 Executive Order No. 141, may open and resume operations provided all of the following apply: 11 The establishment was in existence on March 10, 2020, or had a valid (1)12 certificate of occupancy and business license issued by that date. Total capacity is limited to fifty percent (50%) of the authorized fire capacity. 13 (2)All employees answer a health questionnaire and have their temperature taken 14 (3) daily prior to working. Any employee showing symptoms or with a fever of 15 100.4 degrees Fahrenheit or higher shall not be allowed to enter the 16 17 establishment. 18 All employees wear face masks. All visitors are strongly encouraged to wear (4) 19 face masks. 20 Contactless check-in is available. Markings are on the ground to denote proper (5) social distancing of at least 6 feet in the check-in area. 21 22 Sanitation spray bottles with disinfectant or disinfectant wipes that are (6)23 EPA-approved for SARS-CoV-2 (the virus that causes COVID-19) are 24 available throughout the establishment. 25 Hand sanitizer stations are available throughout the establishment. All hand (7)sanitizer is comprised of at least sixty percent (60%) alcohol. 26 27 (8) Employees conduct frequent routine cleanings of high-touch equipment and high-use areas while the establishment is open and conduct a deep clean of the 28 entire establishment after the close of business every day. For establishments 29 that are open 24 hours a day, a deep clean of the entire establishment must 30 occur at least once every 24 hours. Disinfectants that are EPA-approved for 31 SARS-CoV-2 (the virus that causes COVID-19) are used for all cleanings. 32 33 (9) The following practices must be maintained: Equipment is used in a manner to ensure social distancing of at least 6 34 a. 35 feet. 36 b. Signage directs foot traffic for social distancing.

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1	c. Employees monitor for social distancing and to ensure that equipment
2	is being cleaned with disinfectant or disinfectant wipes.
3	(10) Signage is posted to remind employees, members, and visitors of the social
4	distancing and sanitation requirements in place.
5	SECTION 1.(b) This section is effective when it becomes law and expires when
6	Executive Order No. 141, issued on May 20, 2020, is repealed, replaced, or rescinded.
7	SECTION 2.(a) Notwithstanding Executive Order No. 141, Easing Restrictions on
8	Travel, Business Operations, and Mass Gatherings: Phase Two, issued by Governor Roy A.
9	Cooper on May 20, 2020, any public playground, as referenced in Section 7 of Executive Order
10	No. 141, may open and resume operations provided all of the following apply:
11	(1) The playground was in existence on March 10, 2020, or had a valid certificate
12	of occupancy or business license issued by that date.
13	(2) Total capacity is limited to fifty percent (50%) of the authorized fire capacity.
14	(3) All visitors are strongly encouraged to wear face masks.
15	(4) A cleaning of playground equipment must occur every 24 hours by the entity
16	responsible for its maintenance. Disinfectants that are EPA-approved for
17	SARS-CoV-2 (the virus that causes COVID-19) shall be used for all
18	cleanings.
19	(5) Equipment is used in a manner to ensure social distancing of at least 6 feet.
20	(6) Signage is posted to remind visitors of the social distancing and sanitation
21	requirements in place.
22	(7) The playground shall maintain the social distancing requirements
23	recommended by the federal Centers for Disease Control and Prevention and
24	the North Carolina Department of Health and Human Services.
25	SECTION 2.(b) This section is effective when it becomes law and expires when
26	Executive Order No. 141, issued on May 20, 2020, is repealed, replaced, or rescinded.
27	SECTION 3. This act is effective when it becomes law.
