	SECTION 3.(a) Based on a review of all available data, the State Board of	
	Education, in consultation with the State Superintendent of Public Instruction and the Charter	
	School Advisory Board, shall develop draft policies and procedures for auditing the following	
	information at all public schools, including schools participating in the virtual charter school pilot	
	program established by Section 8.35 of S.L. 2014-100, as amended by Section 8.13 of S.L.	
	2016-94 and Section 7.13 of S.L. 2018-5:	
	(1) Average daily membership at public schools, as reported in the Principal's	
	Monthly Report provided to the Department of Public Instruction by each	
	school.	
	(2) Compliance with the minimum instruction requirements of 185 days or 1,025	
	hours.	
	(3) Compliance with compulsory attendance enforcement requirements provided	
	in G.S. 115C-378.	
	<b>SECTION 3.(b)</b> The State Board of Education shall report on these draft policies	
	and procedures, as well as any legislative recommendations, to the Joint Legislative Education	
	Oversight Committee by March 15, 2020.	
	PART IV. EFFECTIVE DATE	
	<b>SECTION 4.</b> Except as otherwise provided, this act is effective when it becomes law	
	and applies beginning with the 2019-2020 school year.
