For military spouses who hold a current teaching license in another jurisdiction, the provisions of G.S. 115C-270.25 shall apply when issuing teacher 20 21 licenses." 22 **SECTION 7.** This act is effective when it becomes law and applies to applicants for 23 teacher licensure on or after that date.
