SECTION 2. There is appropriated from the General Fund to the Department of	
Public Instruction the sum of fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000) in nonrecurring funds for the	
2022-2023 fiscal year to create a public awareness campaign to inform parents of their rights	
regarding their child's education.	



SECTION 3. This act is effective when it becomes law and applies beginning with the 2022-2023 school year.

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
