HOUSE BILL DRH30484-LU-177A

Short Title: Use Methods of Certain Groups/Voter Rolls. (Public)

Sponsors: Representative Cleveland.

Referred to:

1 A BILL TO BE ENTITLED  
2 AN ACT TO REQUIRE THE STATE BOARD OF ELECTIONS TO USE VARIOUS  
3 METHODS IN ITS LIST MAINTENANCE EFFORTS.

4 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

5 SECTION 1. G.S. 163-82.14, as amended by Section 44(e) of S.L. 2023-140, reads  
6 as rewritten:

7 "§ 163-82.14. List maintenance.

8 (a) Requirement for List Maintenance. – In accordance with this section, the State Board  
9 and county boards of elections shall maintain the list of eligible voters in the State by providing  
10 for the following:

- 11 (1) The removal of the names of ineligible voters from the official lists of eligible  
12 voters.  
13 (2) Updates to the addresses and other necessary data of persons who remain on  
14 the official lists of eligible voters.

15 (a1) Methods of List Maintenance; Cross State Checks. – List maintenance efforts under  
16 this section shall be nondiscriminatory and shall comply with the provisions of the Voting Rights  
17 Act of 1965, as amended, and with the provisions of the National Voter Registration Act. The  
18 State Board, in addition to the methods set forth in this section, ~~may~~ shall use other methods  
19 toward the ends set forth in subsection (a) of this section, including address-updating services  
20 provided by the Postal Service and entering into data sharing agreements with other states to  
21 cross-check information on voter registration and voting records. Any data sharing agreement  
22 shall require the other state or states to comply with G.S. 163-82.10 and G.S. 163-82.10B. The  
23 State Board shall also establish a system that, on an ongoing basis, implements a uniform method  
24 for investigating and correcting the data provided by election integrity organizations to assist in  
25 its list maintenance efforts in identifying and removing ineligible and duplicate registrations. The  
26 State Board shall provide quarterly reports on (i) what corrections were made and (ii) the number  
27 of corrections made, by county. The reports shall be submitted to the House of Representatives  
28 Committee on Election Law and Campaign Finance Reform, the Senate Committee on  
29 Redistricting and Elections, the Joint Legislative Elections Oversight Committee, and the Joint  
30 Legislative Oversight Committee on General Government.

31 ...."

32 SECTION 2. This act becomes effective July 1, 2024.
