SECTION 3. If a majority of votes cast on the question are in favor of the amendment		
set out in Sec	ction 1 of this act, the State Board of Elections shall certify the amendated	ment to the

set out in Section 1 of this act, the State Board of Elections shall certify the amendment to the Secretary of State. The Secretary of State shall enroll the amendment so certified among the permanent records of that office. If a majority of votes cast on the question are against the amendment set out in Section 1 of this act, the amendment shall have no effect.

SECTION 4. The amendment set out in Section 1 of this act is effective upon 27 certification.
