2	AN ACT APPROPRIATING FUNDS TO THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH AND HUMAN			
3	SERVICES, DIVISION OF PUBLIC HEALTH, TO CONTINUE THE STATE'S			
4	PROGRESS IN COMMUNICABLE DISEASE RESPONSE.			
5	Whereas, there are over 80 reportable communicable diseases in North Carolina that			
6	local health departments (LHDs) are responsible for investigating and managing; and			
7	Whereas, the United States is approaching a record number of Avian Influenza (Bird			
8	Flu) outbreaks in wild birds and poultry, which is a potential threat to the public health; and			
9	Whereas, LHDs must respond to the rise and spread of newly emerging and			
10	re-emerging communicable diseases; and			
11	Whereas, in 2018, the North Carolina Legislature appropriated six million seven			
12	hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$6,750,000) in recurring funds for communicable disease			
13	response in the 2018 Appropriations Act, which was ratified by the General Assembly, but was			
14	subsequently vetoed by the Governor; and			
15	Whereas, without this funding for communicable disease response, LHDs were forced			
16	to scramble to identify additional staff and resources to respond to the COVID-19 public health			
17	emergency; and			
18	Whereas, in the 2021 Appropriations Act, the General Assembly made a down			
19	payment of thirty-six million dollars (\$36,000,000) in nonrecurring federal funds for the			
20	2021-2023 fiscal biennium to begin modernizing the State's local communicable disease response			
21	system by expanding communicable disease surveillance, detection, control, and prevention			
22	activities to address the COVID-19 public health emergency and other communicable disease

24 25	Whereas, these funds have been foundational to the efforts of LHDs to respond to the COVID-19 public health emergency and to address other communicable disease challenges; and			
23 26	Whereas, LHDs in North Carolina remain understaffed, with an estimated shortage			
20 27	of 1,700 public health staff at the local level, including communicable disease nurses and other			
28	professionals, who are vital to the State's communicable disease response; Now, therefore,			
29	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:			
30	<b>SECTION 1.(a)</b> There is appropriated from the General Fund to the Department of			
31	Health and Human Services, Division of Public Health, the sum of twenty-five million dollars			
32	(\$25,000,000) in recurring funds for the 2023-2024 fiscal year and the sum of twenty-five million			
33	dollars (\$25,000,000) in recurring funds for the 2024-2025 fiscal year to be allocated to local			
34	health departments, as provided in subsection (b) of this section, to do all of the following:			
35	(1) To continue to address the ongoing challenges of the COVID-19 public health			
36	emergency and other communicable disease challenges.
