SECTION 3. There is appropriated from the General Fund to a Reserve for
Compensation the sum of ten million dollars (\$10,000,000) in recurring funds for the 2023-2024
fiscal year and the sum of ten million dollars (\$10,000,000) in recurring funds for the 2024-2025
fiscal year to fund the paid parental leave authorized by G.S. 126-8.6, as enacted by this act.
SECTION 4. This act becomes effective July 1, 2023.
