The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:		
SECTION 1.(a) Article 22 of Chapter 115C of the General Statutes is amended by		
adding a new Part to read:		
"Part 10. Employee Ethics Training.		
"§ 115C-335.15. Ethics training for certain public school employees.

of contracts, as described in G.S. 14-234, shall receive a minimum of two hours of ethics training,

SECTION 1.(b) All employees of a local school administrative unit involved in the		
making or administering of contracts as of the effective date of this act shall receive an initial		
training to comply with G.S. 115C-335.15, as enacted by subsection (a) of this section, within		

six months of the effective date of this act.
