| A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT TO INCREASE THE PUNISHMENT FOR DISCHARGING OR ATTEMPTING TO DISCHARGE A FIREARM AT OR INTO AN UNOCCUPIED EMERGENCY VEHICLE AND TO INCREASE THE PUNISHMENT FOR POINTING A LASER DEVICE AT A LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICER OR OTHER EMERGENCY PERSONNEL WHEN THE PERSON OR ANIMAL IS IN THE PERFORMANCE OF HIS OR HER DUTIES. The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts: SECTION 1. This act shall be known as the "Protect Those Who Serve and Protect Act." SECTION 2. SECTION 3. G.S. 14-34.8 reads as rewritten:

"§ 14-34.8. Criminal use of laser device.

a Class H felony."

- (a) For purposes of this section, the term "laser" means light amplification by stimulated emission of radiation. The following definitions apply in this section:
 - (1) <u>Laser. Light amplification by stimulated emission of radiation.</u>

a muzzle velocity of at least 600 feet per second at or into any unoccupied emergency vehicle.

This section does not apply to 30 a health care professional who uses a laser device in providing services within the scope of 31 practice of that professional nor to any other person who is licensed or authorized by law to use 32 a laser device or uses it in the performance of the person's official duties. 33 34 This section does not apply to laser tag, paintball guns, and other similar games and 35 devices using light emitting diode (LED) technology." 36 **SECTION 4.** This act becomes effective December 1, 2023, and applies to offenses
