13	to raise funds to promote the interests of the dairy industry.

General Assembly Of North Carolina Session 2023 1 products and the dairy industry, including such administrative expenses as may be reasonably 2 necessary to carry out this function. 3 A dairy producer may request a refund of the assessment collected under this Article (b) 4 by submitting a written request for a refund to the Association postmarked on or before December 5 31 of the same year. A refund request shall be accompanied by proof of payment of the 6 assessment satisfactory to the Association and a written statement that the dairy producer did not 7 receive a benefit from the assessment. The Association shall mail a refund to the dairy producer 8 within 120 days of receipt of a properly documented refund request. 9 "§ 106-816.6. Termination of assessment. Upon receipt of a petition signed by at least fifty percent (50%) of the dairy producers in 10 11 North Carolina known to the Association, the Department shall notify the Association and the Association shall, within six months, conduct a referendum upon the question of continuing the 12 assessment. The referendum shall be conducted in the same manner as the initial referendum 13 14 upon the question of whether an assessment shall be levied. If a majority of the votes cast in the referendum are against continuing the assessment, or if the Association fails to conduct a 15 16 referendum within the six-month period, the assessment expires at the end of the six-month 17 period. If a majority of the votes cast in the referendum are in favor of continuing the assessment, 18 then no subsequent referendum shall be held for at least three years." 19 SECTION 2.(a) G.S. 106-559.1 reads as rewritten: 20 "§ 106-559.1. Basis of vote on milk product assessment. 21 Notwithstanding any other provision of this Article, any milk product assessment referendum 22 conducted pursuant to this Article shall be conducted on the basis of one vote per base holder." 23 SECTION 2.(b) G.S. 106-563.1 reads as rewritten: 24 "§ 106-563.1. Supervision of referendum on milk product assessment. 25 Notwithstanding any other provision of this Article, any milk product assessment referendum 26 conducted pursuant to this Article shall be conducted under the supervision of the County 27 Extension Chairman in each county in which the referendum is held." 28 SECTION 2.(c) G.S. 106-567.1 reads as rewritten: 29 "§ 106-567.1. Refund of milk product assessments. 30 Notwithstanding any other provision of this Article, on and after January 1, 1982, a milk 31 producer shall be entitled to receive a monthly refund of assessments paid by him the milk 32 producer pursuant to this Article by making written demand in the first month of each calendar 33 quarter upon the association receiving such assessment." 34

SECTION 3. This act is effective when it becomes law.
