13	(a) D	efinitions. – The following definitions apply in this section:		
14	(1) Applicant. – A person who applies for a paid or volunteer position with a fire		
15		department or an emergency medical service.		
16	(2) Criminal history. – A State or federal history of conviction of a crime, whether		
17		a misdemeanor or felony, that bears upon a covered person's fitness for		
18		holding a paid or volunteer position with a fire department. The crimes		
19		include, but are not limited to, criminal offenses as set forth in any of the		
20		following Articles of Chapter 14 of the General Statutes: Article 5,		
21		Counterfeiting and Issuing Monetary Substitutes; Article 5A, Endangering		
22		Executive, Legislative, and Court Officers; Article 6, Homicide; Article 7B,		
23		Rape and Other Sex Offenses; Article 8, Assaults; Article 10, Kidnapping and		
24		Abduction; Article 13, Malicious Injury or Damage by Use of Explosive or		
25		Incendiary Device or Material; Article 14, Burglary and Other

40	(d1) An applicant is prohibited from serving in a paid or volunteer position w	ith a fire	
41	department if the applicant's verified criminal history record check reveals a conviction	of arson	
42	or another felony conviction involving burning or setting fire under Article 15, Article 2	2, or any	
43	other Article of Chapter 14 of the General Statutes. A local Homeland Security direct	tor, local	
44	fire chief, county fire marshal, or local law enforcement agency, as applicable, request	ing entity	
45	shall request, and an applicant shall disclose, any pending felony charges involving b	urning or	
46	setting fire under Article 15, Article 22, or any other Article of Chapter 14 of the General	-	
47	Upon becoming aware of pending felony charges, through the required disclosure or by other

1 2 (f) The local fire department shall deny an applicant the position and may dismiss a 3 current member who refuses to consent to a criminal history record check or use of fingerprints 4 or other identifying information required by the State or National Repositories of Criminal 5 Histories. Histories or third-party vendors. This refusal constitutes just cause for the denial of the position or the dismissal from a current position. The local fire department may extend a 6 7 conditional offer of the position pending the (i) results of a criminal history record check required 8 by this section or (ii) final disposition of felony charges disclosed as required by this section or 9 otherwise discovered. 10 11 (h) Except as provided for in subsection (i) of this section, the Department of Public 12 Safety shall charge a reasonable fee for conducting the checks of the criminal history records authorized by this section. If the requesting entity is charged a fee for obtaining a criminal history 13 14 record check, the requesting entity may require the applicant or current member to reimburse the 15 requesting entity the cost incurred. The Department of Public Safety may charge the fire chief of a nonprofit volunteer 16 (i) 17 fire department a fee to cover the cost associated with submission of fingerprints to the Federal Bureau of Investigation for a national criminal history record check provided in accordance with 18 subsection (b) of this section. The Department of Public Safety shall not charge a fee for 19 conducting a statewide criminal history record check for a fire chief of a nonprofit volunteer fire 20 21 department provided in accordance with subsection (b) or (b1) of this section." 22 **SECTION 2.** This act is effective when it becomes law and applies to applications 23 submitted and current members serving on or after that date.
