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For purposes of this section, "health care practitioner" means an individual who is 1 (a) 2 licensed, certified, or registered to engage in the practice of medicine, nursing, dentistry, 3 pharmacy, or any related occupation involving the direct provision of health care to patients. 4 When providing health care to a patient, a health care practitioner shall wear a badge (b)5 or other form of identification displaying in readily visible type the individual's name (i) the 6 health care practitioner's name and (ii) the license, certification, or registration held by the 7 practitioner. If the identity of the individual's license, certification, or registration is commonly 8 expressed by an abbreviation rather than by full title, that abbreviation may be used on the badge 9 or other identification.health care practitioner in a form easily understandable to the patient. 10 When reasonably possible, the badge or other form of identification shall display a photograph 11 of the health care practitioner. At the request of an individual health care practitioner who has a safety concern, the inclusion of the health care practitioner's last name on a badge or other form 12 13 of identification may be waived. The badge or other form of identification shall be of sufficient 14 size and be worn in a conspicuous manner to be visible and apparent. Nothing in this subsection shall be construed to require a health care practitioner to display his or her license, certification, 15 16 or registration number on a badge or other form of identification. 17 (c)The badge or other form of identification is not required to be worn if the patient is being seen in health care practitioner shall display a written document in the health care 18 19 practitioner's office and, that clearly identifies the type of license, certification, or registration 20 held by the health care practitioner and the name and type of license of the health care practitioner 21 can be readily determined by the patient from a the posted license, a sign in the office, a brochure 22 provided to patients, or otherwise.license. 23 Each licensing board or other regulatory authority for health care practitioners may (\mathbf{d}) 24 adopt rules for exemptions from wearing a badge or other form of identification, or for allowing 25 use of the practitioner's first name only, when necessary for the health care practitioner's safety 26 or for therapeutic concerns. 27 (e) Violation of this section is a ground for disciplinary action against the health care 28 practitioner by the practitioner's licensing board or other regulatory authority." 29 **SECTION 3.(b)** This section becomes effective October 1, 2026. 30 SECTION 4. Article 37 of Chapter 90 of the General Statutes is amended by adding 31 the following new sections to read: 32 "§ 90-644. Advertisement and representation requirements. 33 An advertisement for health care services that names a health care practitioner shall (a) 34 identify the type of license, certification, or registration held by the health care practitioner. The 35 advertisement shall not contain any deceptive or misleading information. 36 A health care practitioner shall not make a representation about the health care (b) 37 practitioner's license, certification, or registration that is deceptive or misleading. 38 Any individual not licensed to practice medicine under Article 1 of this Chapter shall (c) 39 not hold himself or herself out to the public by calling oneself a physician or any of the following 40 titles, or using any similar title or description of services with the intent to represent that the individual practices medicine: "surgeon," "medical doctor," "doctor of osteopathy," "M.D.," 41 42 "D.O.," "anesthesiologist," "cardiologist," "dermatologist," "endocrinologist," "gastroenterologist," "general practitioner," "gynecologist," "hematologist," "hospitalist," 43 "internist," "intensivist," "laborist," "laryngologist," "nephrologist," "neurologist," 44 "obstetrician," "oncologist," "ophthalmologist," "orthopedic surgeon," "orthopedist," 45 "otolaryngologist," "otorhinolaryngologist," "osteopath," "otologist," "pathologist," 46 "primary care physician," "proctologist," "psychiatrist," "radiologist," 47 "pediatrician," 48 "rheumatologist," "rhinologist," or "urologist." Nothing in this subsection shall be construed to prevent a health care practitioner from using any title or abbreviation which is authorized for 49 50 such health care practitioner pursuant to licensing statutes.
