Short Title: (Public) Passenger Rail Capital and Service Grant Fund. Representative Loftis. Sponsors: Referred to: A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT TO ESTABLISH THE PASSENGER RAIL CAPITAL AND SERVICE GRANT FUND. The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts: **SECTION 1.** This act shall be known as the "Passenger Rail Capital and Service" Grant Fund." **SECTION 2.** Chapter 136 of the General Statutes is amended by adding a new Article to read: "Article 14D. "Passenger Rail Capital and Service Grant Fund. "§ 136-189.50. Definitions. Definitions. – The following definitions apply to this Article: Reserved for future codification purposes. **(1)** Reserved for future codification purposes. (2) Reserved for future codification purposes. **(3)** (4) Passenger rail project. – A project to develop new or to improve existing railroad, as the term "railroad" is defined in 49 U.S.C. § 20102(2). Reserved for future codification purposes. (5) (6) Sponsor. – A county, city, town, or municipality of this State, and any other political subdivision, public corporation, authority, or district in this State authorized by law to acquire, establish, construct, enlarge, improve, maintain, own, and operate public transportation systems. "§ 136-189.55. Passenger Rail Capital and Service Grant Fund. Creation. – The Passenger Rail Capital and Service Grant Fund (Fund) is established (a) as a special fund within the Department of Transportation to be administered by the Department in accordance with this Article. Purpose. – The purpose of the Fund is to enable passenger rail projects to leverage (b) federal funding or other public or private sourced funding by providing technical and financial assistance to sponsors for the development costs of the passenger rail project. Source. – The Fund shall consist of funds transferred to the Fund in accordance with all of the following: (1) The minimum amount of funds in the Fund at the beginning of each fiscal year shall be twenty-five million dollars (\$25,000,000).



No later than July 30 of each fiscal year, the Department of Transportation

shall transfer from the Highway Fund to the Fund the sum of twenty-five

1			million dollars (\$25,000,000), and these funds are hereby appropriated for
2			eligible uses in accordance with this Article.

27			fewer counties, the total State financial assistance will not exceed the local
28			portion of the nonfederal share of the capital cost of the passenger rail project.
29		<u>(3)</u>	The passenger rail project will achieve substantial reductions in greenhouse
30			gases as measured by the projected number of motor vehicles taken off of the
31			State highway system by the passenger service offered by the project.
32	<u>(c)</u>	Decis	ion All grants made under this Article are subject to the approval of the
33	Secretary	of Tran	asportation after consultation with the Board of Transportation.
34	<u>(d)</u>	Multi	year Allotments The Department may allocate funds under this Article in the
35	form of m	nultiyea	r allotments. No award under this Article shall exceed a period of 10 years. Any
36	grant awarded under this Article is subject to appropriation of funds by the General Assembly.		

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- Project Development. The Department shall partner with individual sponsors on the development and implementation of new passenger rail projects.

"§ 136-189.65. Expiration.

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This Article is repealed effective June 30, 2043. The Department shall transfer any remaining balance in the Fund to the Highway Fund, for subsequent appropriation by the General Assembly, and close the Fund."

SECTION 3. This act is effective when it becomes law.

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
