SECTION 1.(f) G.S. 150B-1(d) is amended by adding a new subdivision to read:
"(34) The State Board of Education with respect to adoption of the standard course
of study as required by Part 1 of Article 8 of Chapter 115C of the General
Statutes."
SECTION 1.(g) Initial appointments to the Standard Course of Study Advisory
Commission shall be made by the General Assembly for terms beginning July 1, 2023, and shall
be appointed as follows:
(1) Notwithstanding G.S. 115C-81.6, as enacted by this act, members appointed
pursuant to G.S. 115C-81.6(c)(1)a., c., e., and g. and G.S. 115C-81.6(c)(2)b.,
d., f., and h. shall be appointed for two-year terms.
(2) Members appointed pursuant to G.S. 115C-81.6(c)(1)b., d., f., and h. and
G.S. 115C-81.6(c)(2)a., c., e., and g. shall be appointed for four-year terms.
SECTION 1.(h) Notwithstanding G.S. 115C-81.7(a), the Standard Course of Study
Advisory Commission shall review the social studies standard course of study during the
2023-2024 school year and provide recommendations to the State Board of Education no later
than January 1, 2025.
SECTION 2. This act is effective when it becomes law and applies to all standard
courses of study implemented on or after that date.
