A BILL TO BE ENTITLED  AN ACT TO PROVIDE FOR EMERGENCY PREPAREDNESS EDUCATION IN SCHOOLS. The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:  SECTION 1. Part 1 of Article 8 of Chapter 115C of the General Statutes is amended by adding a new section to read:				
"§ 115C-81.33. Emergency preparedness education.				
(a) Instruction shall be provided in emergency preparedness from kindergarten through high school. The State Board of Education shall adopt standards for instruction in emergency preparedness, differentiated between elementary school, middle school, and high school.  (b) Standards for elementary school instruction shall begin not before grade 3 and include at least the following:
