## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

- 2 AN ACT TO APPROPRIATE FUNDS FOR A POSITION WITHIN THE DEPARTMENT OF 3 HEALTH AND HUMAN SERVICES TO ASSIST WITH STATEWIDE NAVIGATION 4 FOR THE FOOD AND NUTRITION SERVICES (FNS) EDUCATION AND TRAINING 5 PROGRAM AND TO REOUIRE THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH AND HUMAN 6 SERVICES TO IMPLEMENT TWELVE-MONTH CERTIFICATION PERIODS FOR 7 HOUSEHOLDS ELIGIBLE TO RECEIVE A TWELVE-MONTH CERTIFICATION 8 UNDER FEDERAL LAW.
- 9 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

SECTION 1. There is appropriated from the General Fund to the Department of 10 Health and Human Services, Division of Child and Family Well-Being (Division), the sum of 11 forty-three thousand two hundred fifty dollars (\$43,250) in recurring funds for each year of the 12 13 2023-2025 fiscal biennium to provide the State's fifty percent (50%) match toward salary and benefits costs for a position to assist with statewide navigation for the food and nutrition services 14 education and training (FNS E&T) program. The Division shall use the position to focus on 15 counties with insufficient navigator staffing for their FNS E&T programs. 16

SECTION 2.(a) Part 5 of Article 2 of Chapter 108A of the General Statutes is 17 18 amended by adding a new section to read:

## 19 "§ 108A-52.1. Certifications; food and nutrition services.

20 The Department shall implement 12-month certification periods for all households eligible 21 to receive a 12-month certification under federal law. The Social Services Commission shall

- adopt rules to implement the provisions of this section." 22
- **SECTION 2.(b)** This section is effective when it becomes law. 23
- 24 **SECTION 3.** Except as otherwise provided, this act becomes effective July 1, 2023.
