

40	PART III. EFFECTIVE DATE AND APPLICABILITY CLAUSE
41	SECTION 3. This act becomes effective January 1, 2024, and applies to school
42	achievement grades, growth grades, and report cards issued based on data from the 2023-2024
43	school year
