

1 A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 2 AN ACT TO INCREASE THE CHILD TAX DEDUCTION AMOUNT, TO CREATE THE CHILD CARE STABILIZATION FUND TO ASSIST IN STABILIZING THE CHILD 3 4 CARE WORKFORCE AND ENSURE ACCESS TO QUALITY CHILD CARE, TO ESTABLISH THE CHILD CARE PROVIDER SUPPORT PROGRAM TO OFFER 5 6 FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE TO CHILD CARE PROVIDERS IN THIS STATE, AND TO APPROPRIATE FUNDS FOR THOSE PURPOSES. 7 8 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts: 9 10 PART I. INCREASE CHILD TAX DEDUCTION AMOUNT 11 **SECTION 1.1.** G.S. 105-153.5(a1) reads as rewritten: 12 "(a1) Child Deduction Amount. – A taxpayer who is allowed a federal child tax credit under section 24 of the Code for the taxable year is allowed a deduction under this subsection for each 13 14 qualifying child for whom the taxpayer is allowed the federal tax credit.
