OVERVIEW: *The PCS to H472 would allow funds in the School Bus Replacement Fund to be used to match federal funds for programs and activities at North Carolina State University and at North Carolina Agricultural and Technical State University and would permit North Carolina Agricultural and Technical State University to sell dairy products at University-owned facilities to support its agricultural programs.*

BILL ANALYSIS:

Section 1 would transfer \$2,000,000 in nonrecurring funds from the School Bus Replacement Fund to the Budget Code for North Carolina State University (NC State University). The funds would then be appropriated to the Board of Governors of The University of North Carolina to be allocated to NC State University to be used for NC State University's participation in a collaborative effort to accelerate the development of innovative manufacturing processes for biopharmaceutical products and as matching funds for a federal grant from the National Institute of Standards and Technology.

Section 2 would transfer \$3,000,000 in nonrecurring funds from the School Bus Replacement Fund to the Budget Code for North Carolina Agricultural and Technical State University (NC A&T State University). The funds would then be appropriated to the Board of Governors of The University of North Carolina to be allocated to NC A&T State University to be used to support its agricultural research and cooperative extension activities by matching federal funds awarded to NC A&T State University as a land-grant university.

Section 3 would permit NC A&T State University to sell dairy products produced by the University Farm at University-owned facilities so long as any profits are used to support the Agricultural Research Program and the College of Agriculture and Environmental Sciences at NC A&T State University.

Section 4 is boilerplate language providing that the State Budget Act is not superseded by this act.

Section 5 is boilerplate language providing that other bills enacted during the 2019 Regular Session of the General Assembly appropriating funds remain in effect.
