OVERVIEW: *House Bill 95 would require an individual who became a donor in another jurisdiction to consent to an authorizing symbol on their North Carolina drivers license to make an anatomical gift and would clarify the authorizing symbol remains until a donor revokes consent by requesting removal of the symbol.*

BILL ANALYSIS:

Section 1 would amend G.S. 130A-412.7. An individual who has made an anatomical gift in another jurisdiction through an authorizing symbol, and applies for a North Carolina drivers license or identification card, would have to authorize the symbol on the drivers license or identification card issued here for it to be valid.

Section 2 would add a new subsection to G.S. 130A-412.7. A symbol authorizing donation on a North Carolina drivers license or identification card would remain until the individual requests removal of the symbol, in a manner prescribed by the Division of Motor Vehicles.

This bill would clarify the law but not change current practice of the Division of Motor Vehicles.

EFFECTIVE DATE: This act would become effective October 1, 2021.
