In calendar year 2012 there were 36 distinct juveniles transferred to Superior Court. The 36 juveniles had a total of 160 complaints transferred. On average, each juvenile had 4.44 complaints transferred and the range was 1 to 27 complaints transferred per juvenile. The charged class and the age at offense of the complaints transferred with the juveniles are as follows.
