Dear Speaker Moore and Senator Berger:

The Alcohol Law Enforcement Branch is a participant in the Equitable Sharing of Federally Forfeited Property Program with the United States Department of Justice and the U.S. Department of Treasury. As a result of participation in this program and the support of the Joint Legislative Commission on Government Operations, the Section has been able to provide valuable equipment and support to its members in the pursuit of its mission. The items included in this request are needed to enhance officer and public safety.

Pursuant to Section 16B.1(b) of the Appropriations Act of 2013, this correspondence reports the Alcohol Law Enforcement Section's intent to use \$120,000.00 in Federal Asset Forfeiture funds to support the law enforcement and public safety purchases listed below. As of July 10, 2015, the balance of the Federal Asset Forfeiture Funds held by the Section is \$2,923,087.16. The new balance of this account will be \$2,803,087.16 after the listed expenditures. Moveable and Replaceable Items: The funds would be utilized to replace aging and inefficient items that support operational functions in the various offices. As an example of items which may be included in this, but not limited to, are copy machines, printers, office furniture, computers, and printer ink cartridges.	\$35,000.00
Clothing and Personal Protective Replaceable Equipment: The funds would be utilized to purchase items that are issued to Special Agents. As an example of items which may be included in this, but not limited to, are boots, weapon holsters, rain gear, firearms accessories, tasers, flashlights, shirts pants, coats, jackets, bullet proof vests, gun cleaning kits, protective goggles, and latex gloves.	\$35,000.00
Training: Training is an essential tool in the investigation and enforcement process. In order to maintain the highest level of efficiency and safety, continual training is paramount. This funding will allow specific training to accomplish Branch goals through the ability of agents to attend training activities to enhance their ability to perform their given tasks at a higher level of proficiency. Areas of training include such things as search warrant preparation, criminal process, leadership, management, and advanced criminal investigations, which are essential for professional development and advancement of the Branch's goals.	\$50,000.00
