

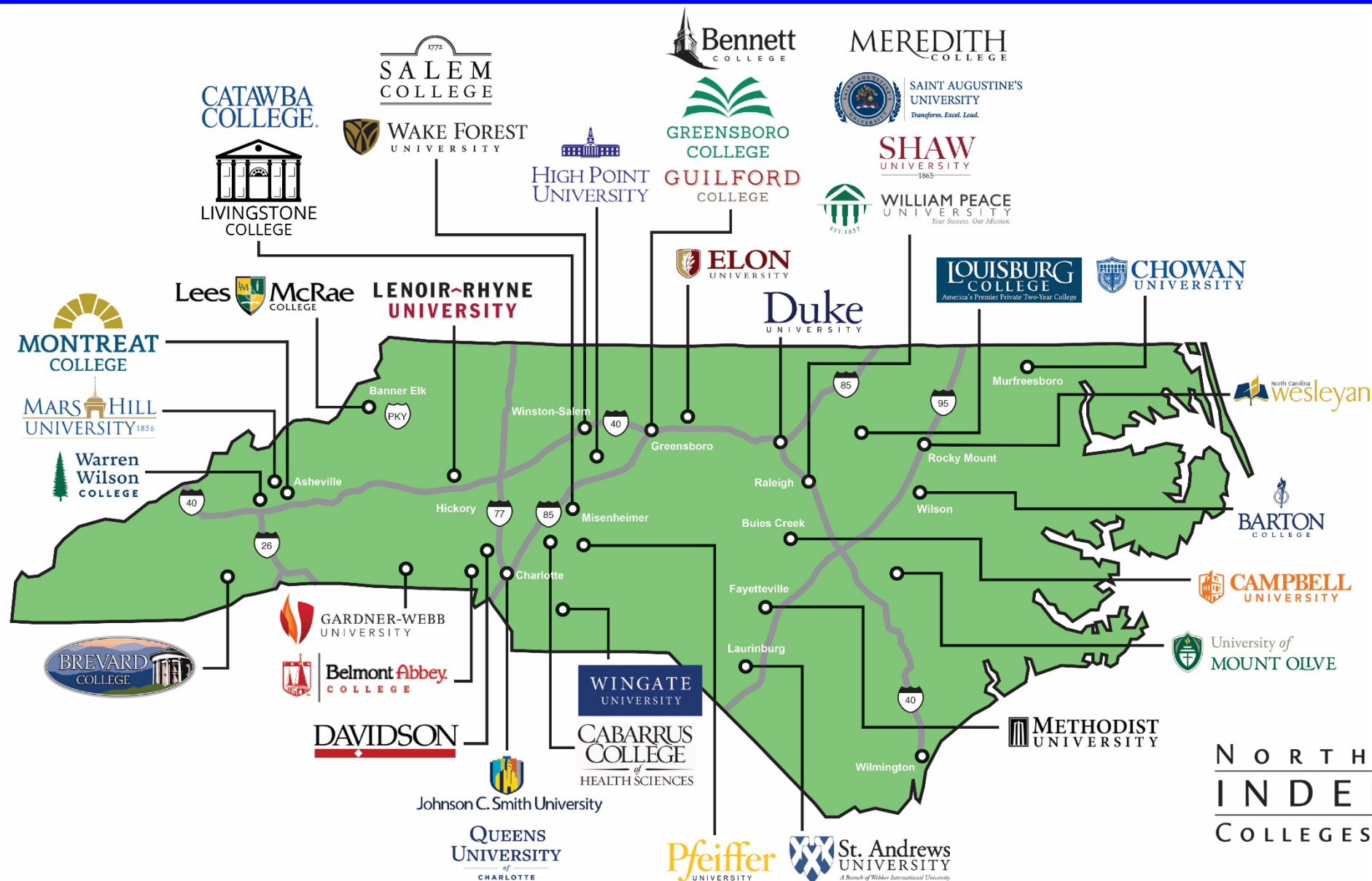

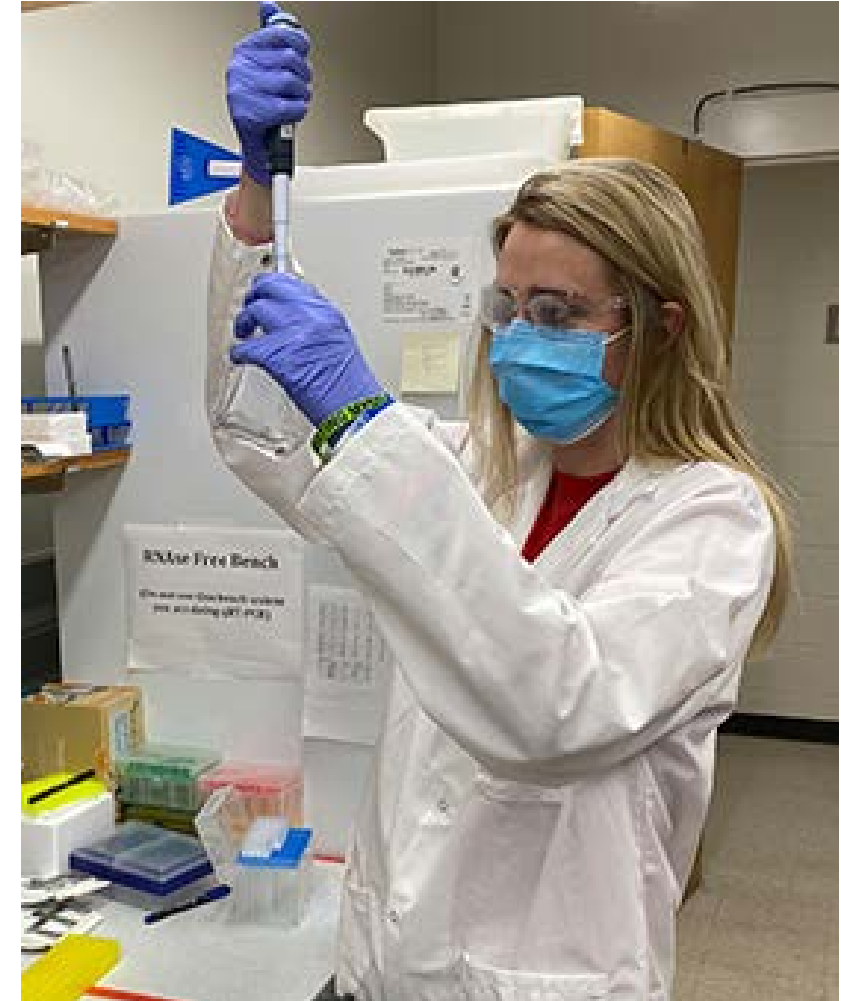
NCICU Institutions Received More than \$1.5 Billion in Research Funding in FY 2018-2019

Senate Bill 704

- Clinical internships for EPP students and Health Sciences students

- Licensure requirements for other school personnel

House Bills 1043 & 1105

- \$30 million for:
 - Students and families affected by COVID-19 at independent colleges and universities; and
 - Transition to remote education
 - PPE

House Bill 118

- Legal protection for businesses and nonprofits

Senate Bill 208

- Limited liability protection from lawsuits related to COVID-19

COVID-19 Response

- 33 Campuses offering in-person and hybrid classes with 3 remote
- De-densified residence halls and classrooms, instituted PPE protections
- Campuses have served as testing and vaccination sites including vaccine storage, are providing mobile health clinics for education, training, health screening and vaccinations
- Using testing for entry, surveillance and symptomatic testing
- Many campuses are using Apps for daily monitoring of students, faculty, staff



Articulation Agreements with NCCCS

30 NCICU campuses have signed the Independent Comprehensive Articulation Agreement

Additional projects: Reverse Transfer and Finish First NC



Legislative Priorities for 2019

- Increase in recurring funding of State Need-Based Aid of **\$8m** - from \$88.9m to \$96.9m
- **\$6m** in non-recurring financial aid for students whose families have been negatively affected by COVID-19 and for COVID-19 expenses
- **\$750k** to provide a scholarship to North Carolinians who graduate from the North Carolina School of Science and Mathematics and attend an NCICU institution
