JOINT SELECT COMMITTEE ON JUDICIAL REFORM AND REDISTRICTING

Section 1. The Joint Select Committee on Judicial Reform and Redistricting (hereinafter "Committee") is established by the President Pro Tempore of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of Representatives pursuant to G.S. 120-19.6(a1), Rule 31 of the Rules of the Senate of the 2017 General Assembly, and Rule 26(a) of the Rules of the House of Representatives of the 2017 General Assembly.

Section 2. The Committee consists of 30 members. The President Pro Tempore of the Senate shall appoint 15 Senators to the Committee. The Speaker of the House of Representatives shall appoint 15 Representatives to the Committee. The President Pro Tempore of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of Representatives shall each appoint co-chairs from among their respective appointees. A co-chair or other member of the Committee continues to serve until a successor is appointed. Members serve at the pleasure of the appointing officer.

Section 3. The Committee may examine:

- (1) Reforms to the State's judicial system
- (2) Redistricting as it relates to the State's judicial districts
- (3) The present and future judicial needs of the State's population
- (4) Any other judicial reform or judicial redistricting issue

Section 4. The Committee shall meet upon the call of its House and Senate co-chairs. A quorum of the Committee is a majority of its members. No action may be taken except by a majority vote at a meeting at which a quorum is present.

Section 5. The Committee, while in the discharge of its official duties, may exercise all powers provided for under G.S. 120-19 and Article 5A of Chapter 120 of the General Statutes. The Committee may contract for professional, clerical, or consultant services, as provided by G.S. 120-32.02.

Section 6. Members of the Committee shall receive per diem, subsistence, and travel allowance as provided in G.S. 120-3.1, 138-5 and 138-6, as appropriate.


Section 7. The expenses of the Committee shall be considered expenses incurred for the joint operation of the General Assembly. Individual expenses of five thousand dollars (\$5,000) or less, including per diem, travel, and subsistence expenses of members of the Committee, and clerical expenses shall be paid upon the authorization of a co-chair of the Committee. Individual expenses in excess of five thousand dollars (\$5,000) shall be paid upon the written approval of the President Pro Tempore of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of Representatives. All expenses of the Committee shall be paid from the Legislative Services Commission's Reserve for Studies.

Section 8. The Legislative Services Officer shall assign professional and clerical staff to assist the Committee in its work. The Director of Legislative Assistants of the House of Representatives and the Director of Legislative Assistants of the Senate shall assign clerical support staff to the Committee.

Section 9. The Committee may meet at various locations around the State in order to promote greater public participation in its deliberations.

Section 10. The Committee may submit an interim or final report on the results of its work, including any proposed legislation, to the members of the Senate and the House of Representatives prior to the convening of, or during, any session of the General Assembly convening in 2018 by filing a copy of the report with the Office of the President Pro Tempore of the Senate, the Office of the Speaker of the House of Representatives, and the Legislative Library. The Committee shall terminate upon the convening of the 2019 General Assembly or upon the filing of its final report, whichever occurs first.
